

IF YOU GIVE A PIG A PANCAKE

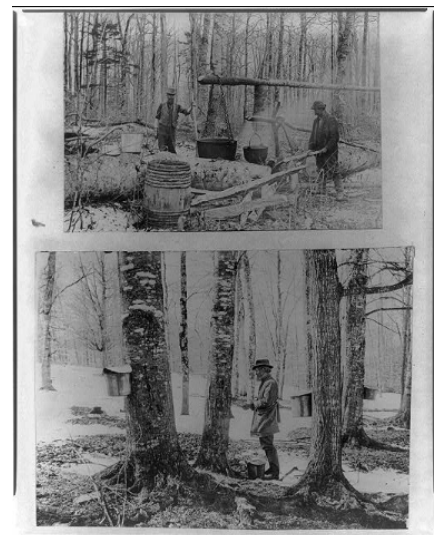
INTRODUCTION
